Year to date the Northwest Division has observed a 7% decrease in Part One offenses with a 55% reduction in Robbery, serving as the most significant contributor in the overall decrease. While many factors contribute to crime trends, it is imperative that we all do our part to prevent crime by following these best practices:

Never leave your vehicle running and unattended.

Always lock your vehicle and do not leave valuables in plain sight.

Never leave key fobs or garage door openers in your vehicle.

Communicate with your neighbors, pay attention to your surroundings, and report criminal or suspicious activity.

Finally, due to COVID-19 the Northwest Division remains closed to the public; however, arrangement to meet with staff can be facilitated by phone and will be conducted in compliance with CDC COVID-19 guidelines.

The Little Rock Police Department now has a Telephone Reporting Unit. With the growth of our city, we have now established a phone number and email to address the growing needs of our community.

Effective immediately, citizens can also call 501-918-4397 or email TRU@littlerock.gov to report the following:

- Auto Breaking or Entering (delayed report or single incident)
- Criminal Mischief
- Directed Patrol Request
- Financial Identity Fraud
- Forgery
- Fraudulent Use of a Credit Card
- General Information
- Harassing Communications
- Hit and Run Accident (No Injury- Private Property)
- Lost/Stolen License Plate
- Private Property Accident (No Injury)
- Terroristic Threatening (Suspect Not Present)
- Theft Reports, to include shoplifting incidents in which no suspect is in custody
- Vacation Home Reports
- Lost or Missing Property
- Reporting supplemental information to an existing report
- Private Property damage when there is no apparent criminal intent
- Fraudulent payment/solicitation scams (No suspect information)
- Attempted breaking and entering of unoccupied buildings, such as: garages, sheds, vacant or foreclosed homes

If anyone has used the non-emergency number (501)371-4829 in the past, you may still use it. However, we ask that you only use it in times of non-emergency that does not apply to the above list and still may need the assistance of an officer. Again, as the needs of the City of Little Rock expand, the Little Rock Police Department is committed to implementing effective measures designed to serve the community.

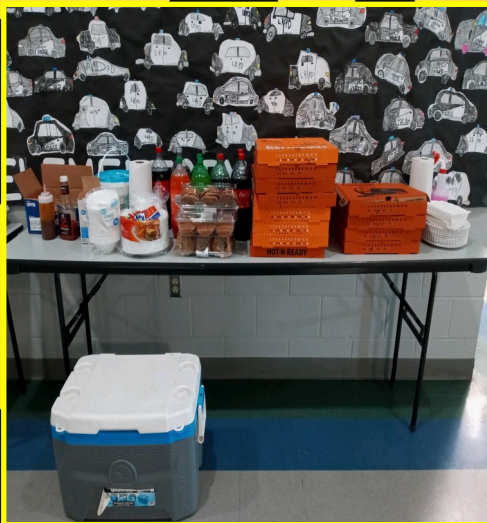

APPLICATION AND PRELIMINARY BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION: Applicants are required to complete an application and all supplemental questions on-line at: <https://www.governmentjobs.com/careers/LittleRock>. Candidates will receive a confirmation email once their application has been submitted successfully.

Human Resources will submit all candidates to LRPD personnel for a preliminary background check. If any of the following are found during the preliminary background, the candidate will be automatically disqualified:

- Invalid driver's license
- Prior felony conviction - NOTE: Expunged and/or pardoned felonies still disqualify candidates from employment as a Police Officer.
- Prior domestic abuse conviction
- Excessive traffic points accrued within the past three years.

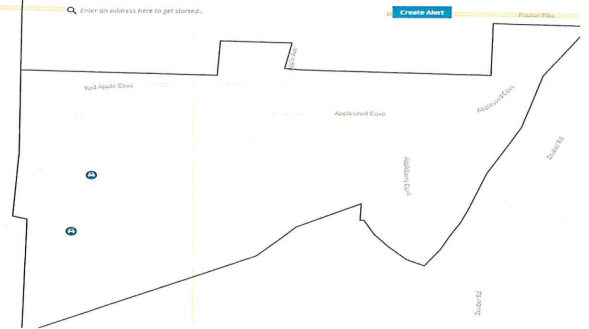

Little Rock Citizen Connect

To my fellow Little Rock residents,

In Little Rock's continuing effort to make the City's data available to the public, City Hall is proud to offer this Citizen Connect website. The site contains 311 requests, Little Rock Police Crime Data, Planning Permits and Housing & Neighborhood Programs information in one easy place to navigate. By providing this information in an easily searchable format, it is the City's hope that citizens will be able to quickly understand what's happening around their home or business at any given time.

Citizens can sign up to receive emails from the site which will provide updates on the timetable and information they chose. Examples of updates which can be provided are when a Code Violation is entered into the 311 system or when there is a public safety incident in your neighborhood. The site also allows users to view where requests are coming in, do queries by date range and item type and shows some simple trend analysis on the data being viewed.

Search for your address or filter by Ward, or a specific information type. Choose the information you want to know about, and save your search by creating a free account - simply click "Sign in" in the top right of your screen, and register by clicking "Sign Up" at the bottom of the pop-up window. Please remember that in order to receive email alerts on recent activity in your area, you must also register for a free account.
